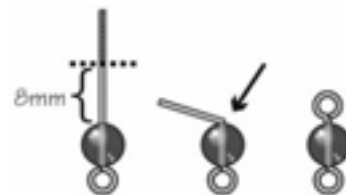
## Suggested Materials:

<u>Qty.</u>	<u>Stock</u>	<u>Name</u>
2	#05-742-08-134	8mm Swarovski® crystal heart beads, white alabaster
3	#05-742-08-20	8mm Swarovski crystal heart beads, siam
10	#37-212	Oval jump rings, sterling silver
1	#39-550-I	Heart/arrow toggle clasp, sterling silver
3	#44-048-22	Flower on stem charms, sterling silver
3	#44-048-31	Tiny skull & crossbones charms, sterling silver
1	#44-048-32	Skull & crossbones charms, sterling silver
6	#44-048-33	Skull & crossbones connector charms, sterling silver

**Tools needed:**  
cutters, round-nose pliers,  
jump-ring tool (#69-079)

## To make this design:

- Heart links:** Insert an eye pin into a heart bead. Bend the eye pin to a 90° angle and form a loop with your round-nose pliers (as pictured to the right). Trim any excess wire with cutters, and then pinch the loop again slightly so the end of the eye pin tucks into the hole of the heart bead. Repeat until you have 5 crystal heart connectors.
- Connect the hearts to the skull connectors using either a jump-ring tool or pliers: open the jump ring and, once you've connected the loop of your heart connector and the loop of the skull connector, close the ring. Continue to alternate skull and heart connectors until you've reached your desired length. (Standard wrist size for a medium wrist is 7".)
- Using jump rings, connect the skull connectors on each end to the heart/arrow toggle clasp.
- Adding the charms:** Attach charms to jump rings between connectors using a second jump ring. Our designer staggered charms evenly (tiny skull, then flower, repeat) but the order in which you attach your charms is what keeps your piece unique (add/substitute whatever charms fit your style)!



**TIP:** When you open and close jump rings, twist sideways (as shown to the right). This keeps their shape better and makes them easier to close all the way.

**TIP:** Keep in mind that crystals are leaded glass, and are very fragile! Use caution when looping/cutting wire up against your crystal beads.
