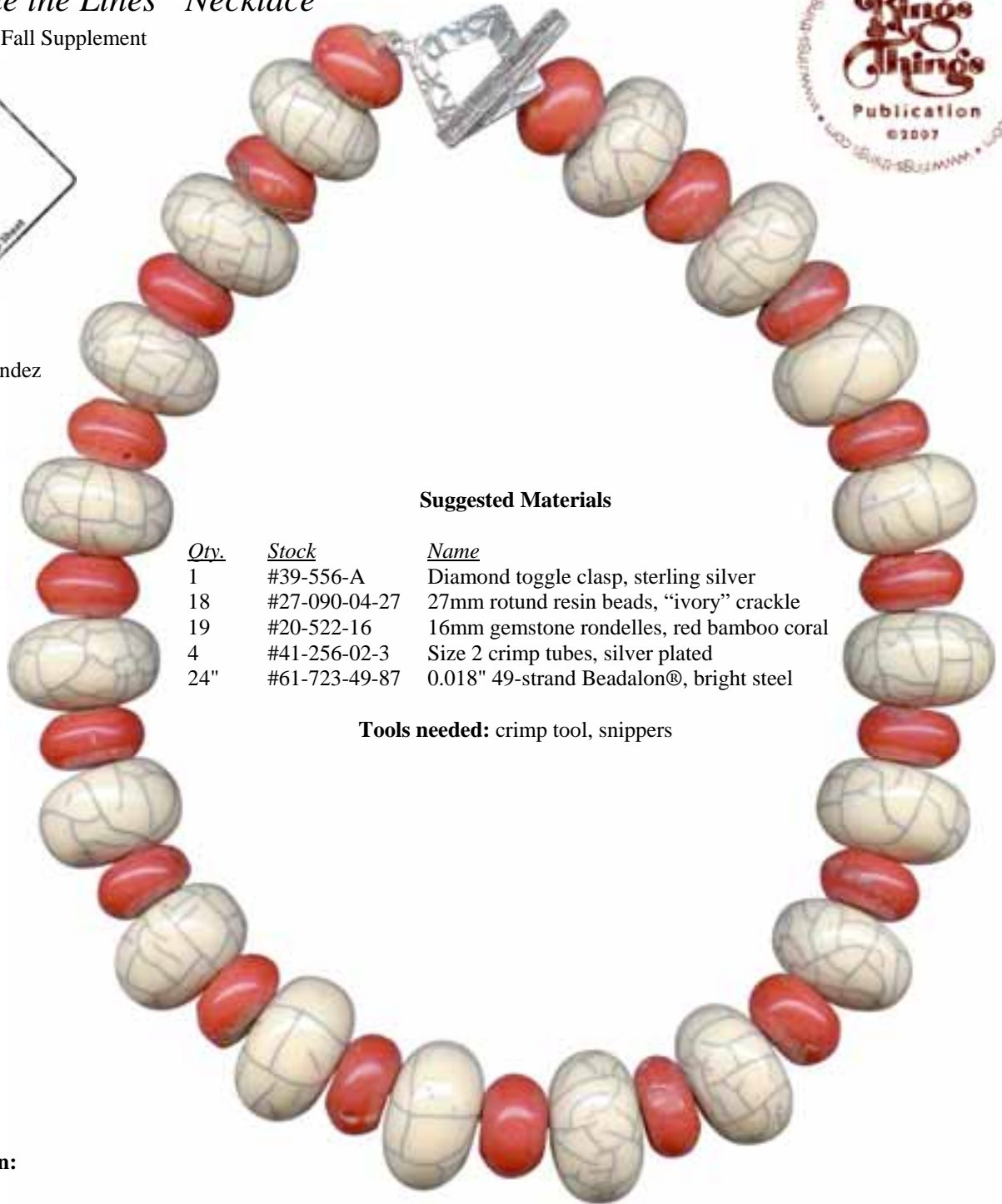


“Coral Inside the Lines” Necklace

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Suggested Materials

<u>Qty.</u>	<u>Stock</u>	<u>Name</u>
1	#39-556-A	Diamond toggle clasp, sterling silver
18	#27-090-04-27	27mm rotund resin beads, “ivory” crackle
19	#20-522-16	16mm gemstone rondelles, red bamboo coral
4	#41-256-02-3	Size 2 crimp tubes, silver plated
24"	#61-723-49-87	0.018" 49-strand Beadalon®, bright steel

Tools needed: crimp tool, snippers

To make this design:

1. Using 2 crimp beads, crimp one end of the toggle clasp to the Beadalon.
2. String beads, starting with one coral bead and one resin bead. Alternate beads until you have a total of 37 beads (for a necklace approximately 20" long).
3. Finish the necklace by adding 2 crimp beads and your remaining toggle end.

TIP: When crimping the ends of necklaces, leave a little slack. This will help the beads lay right around the neck.
