These natural, unfinished wood charms are flat and lightweight; great for embellishing rubber-stamped designs.

We recommend using large (5-6mm) jump rings to hang.

How to embellish wood charms:

1. These wood charms are ready to use as-is, but may also be colored with paints (all types), markers or dyes. If applying stain, lacquer or another wood finish, the manufacturer suggests lightly sanding the charm with 320-grit sandpaper.

TIP: Lay the charm flat on the sandpaper and rub back and forth about 10 times on each side. Blow or wipe off the sawdust before staining.

2. Embellish them even more by drilling extra holes with a small drill and attaching danglers. Natural or dyed wood charms make a fun addition to treasure and found-object bracelets.
