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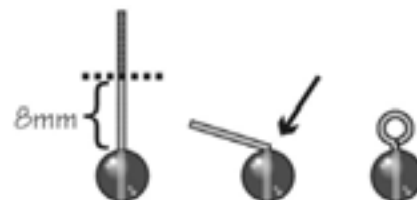


Tools: round-nose pliers, needle-nose pliers, flat-nose pliers, side cutters



Suggested Materials:

25"	#40-099-07-6	4.5mm rolo chain, antiqued brass
14	#37-722-6	2" standard eye pins, antiqued brass
54	#37-415-6	1.5" thin head pins, antiqued brass
14	#05-810-08-203	8mm Swarovski® crystal pearls, bronze
21	#05-301-03-119	3mm Swarovski crystal faceted bicones, crystal/dorado 2x
11	#05-301-04-119	4mm Swarovski crystal faceted bicones, crystal/dorado 2x
22	#05-301-06-119	6mm Swarovski crystal faceted bicones, crystal/dorado 2x



Tools:

To make this design:

1. Cut the chain into five equal sections, each 41 links long (exact number of links is necessary for the pattern to lay out properly). Open the first link of a piece of chain and attach it to the first hole in one of the leather ends. Close the link. Repeat this step 4 times with the remaining pieces of chain. Attach the opposite ends of the chain to the remaining cuff in the same manner, making sure that the chain lies correctly.
2. To attach the crystal pearls to the chain, string an eye pin through a selected link of the chain (see coversheet) and insert a crystal pearl onto the eye pin. Then string the end of the eye pin through the opposite link and cut the eye pin, leaving just enough wire to shape a similar eye. Use your round-nose pliers to create the eye. Repeat this step with the remaining 13 pearls. The bracelet contains four open rows (the space between rows of chain). Position your pearls on the following links:
 - a. Row one: #3, #15, #27, and #39.
 - b. Row two: #7, #19, and #31
 - c. Row three: #11, #23, and #35
 - d. Row four: #3, #15, #27, and #39
3. To make a crystal-bicone dangle, string a crystal bicone onto a head pin and cut the pin so it is just long enough to create an eye. Use round-nose pliers to bend the eye. Repeat this step with the remaining crystal bicones.
4. Attach crystal-bicone dangles to crystal pearl eye-pin loops by opening the eye on the dangle, attaching it to the bracelet and then closing the eye. Vary the number and placement of crystals to personal preference.
